1. REPORTS

a. CHAIR'S REPORT (Jen Peebles)

- Mike will talk to teachers about explaining things to the students that go out from the PAC at the next staff meeting, such as the upcoming read-a-thon.
- Swimming was only recently decided who was swimming and at what times
- Bottles possibility of looking at a bottle drive in the future as a fundraiser
- As a note Kim Morris mentioned that she will be stepping down in the fall.
 She is willing to train anyone interested. She will stay on until the AGM in October.

e. PRICIPAL REPORT (Mike Hurley)

- Worrisome event there was a situation that occurred that required the RCMP to be called – little boy indicated that someone was trying to abduct him
- Illness 45 kids sick @ Winlaw school. 29 students were out this week at Brent Kennedy and over 40 last week. If more than 10% of the student population is out sick Mr. Hurley called the Public Health Nurse to see if there is an outbreak in the area.
- Custodians pay extra attention to cleaning surfaces such as door knobs, etc. They use WHMIS approved products.


